Welcome to my cello studio! I specialize in providing private cello lessons to students of any age and ability. Playing the cello is a nuanced endeavor, and an enjoyable experience with the instrument requires a substantial understanding of fundamental techniques. A primary objective of private cello lessons is to enhance the student's fluency of these fundamental aspects of the instrument, including intonation, rhythm, and tone production. My approach to these techniques is rooted in a classical methodology, but is applicable across genres.

Lessons at student's home:

I am willing to travel to your home and/or a mutually agreeable location other than those listed above under the following conditions:

- Lessons must be scheduled Monday-Friday before 2:30pm
- If you live within Boise city limits and/or your location is less than a 20-mile round trip from 325 Old Saybrook Dr, Boise ID 83706, a flat rate of \$10 per lesson will be added to the regular lesson fee
- If you live outside Boise city limits and/or your location is more than a 20-mile round trip, the standard IRS business mileage rate of \$0.585 per mile will be added to the regular lesson fee

Lesson Descriptions

30-minute lesson

- 30-minute private lessons are recommended for most students, especially ages 8-15 (Elementary through early High School).
- Students will focus on preparing solo pieces in addition to music assigned from Public Schools Orchestra, Elementary/Junior High Honor Orchestra, or BPYO.
- Students will develop a basic understanding of fundamental cello technique, including intonation, rhythm, and posture.
- Students are expected to practice the assigned lesson materials at least 20 minutes 5 days a week.

60-minute Lesson

- 60-minute private lessons are offered at my discretion to advanced students of any age.
- Students will focus on:
 - o Developing a daily warm-up routine, including scales and various exercises;
 - Technical studies;
 - Solo repertoire;
 - Audition material for Elementary/Junior High Honor Orchestra, BPYO, All State,
 Public Schools Chamber Orchestras, summer music festivals, etc.;
 - Repertoire assigned from the above organizations.
- Students will develop a thorough understanding of fundamental cello technique, including intonation, rhythm, posture, tone production, and sight reading.
- Students are expected to practice the assigned lesson materials at least 60 minutes 5 days a week.

Materials

Students are expected to come to each lesson with the following materials:

- All assigned music, including private lesson method books and material from curricular and extracurricular ensembles.
- A blank, spiral notebook
- Metronome/tuner
- Most of the materials I'll use in private lessons can be downloaded via this <u>Google Drive</u> <u>Folder</u>. Students are also welcome to purchase their own editions.

Expectations

Students are expected to practice the daily amount recommended throughout the week and come to each lesson prepared with the assigned material. I will work to provide the student with personalized guidance appropriate to their current level of ability each week. In turn, the student is expected to explore and practice concepts and techniques presented throughout the week. A respect for this student-teacher relationship will result in the best possible experience in the private lesson setting and playing the cello in general.

I am aware that some concepts and techniques take time to develop. In my experience, however, there is a significant difference in the degree of success of students who attempt to understand difficult topics in practice sessions and students who do not. If a student attempts a difficult

concept and encounters problems or questions, the student is encouraged to communicate with me throughout the week and/or is expected to come to the following lesson prepared with questions. Though I never expect perfection, I do expect students to try their best!

Cancellation & Late Policy

- Please notify me via text or email if you need to cancel or reschedule a lesson.
- I will reschedule lessons if at all possible. I am unable to offer refunds for canceled or missed lessons.
- If I need to cancel a lesson, I will provide 24-hour notice and options for rescheduling. If rescheduling is impossible, I will apply that lesson credit to the following month.
- If a student misses more than two lessons in a semester without notification, I will no longer reserve a lesson time for that student.
- If a student is more than 10 minutes late to a scheduled lesson, the lesson will be considered canceled. Though I might still be in the studio and available to teach for the remaining time, I can't guarantee this. I am unable to offer refunds in this scenario.

Dr. Jake Saunders is a cellist, educator, and collaborative artist.

Saunders serves as Associate Principal Cello with the Boise Philharmonic, where he also performs as a member of the Boise Philharmonic String Quartet. He is also a newly appointed member of the Long Beach Symphony Orchestra cello section. As an active member of the Playground Ensemble and Sphere Ensemble, Saunders has established himself as a sought after collaborative artist in Colorado. Other Colorado-based projects have included Boulder Altitude Directive (BAD), Boulder Symphony, and Pro Musica Chamber Orchestra.

Saunders is a founding member and Artistic Director of 208 ensemble, the first professional ensemble in Idaho dedicated to the advocacy and performance of music written by living composers. Since 2014, 208 ensemble has presented the Idaho-premiere of more than 50 contemporary works. Additionally, Saunders is the creator of Boise Cello Collective, a collaborative project among some of Idaho's preeminent cellists specializing in the performance of classical, contemporary, and popular music in nontraditional venues. Saunders serves as the group's director, arranger, and principal cellist.

Saunders has held principal orchestral positions with Symphony Tacoma and the Opera Idaho Orchestra and has performed with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Utah Symphony, Boise Philharmonic, and the New Hampshire Music Festival. Additionally, Saunders has served as principal cellist with the symphonies of the University of Colorado Boulder, Boise State University, and University of Michigan, as well as the Music Academy of the West's Festival Orchestra and Aspen Music Festival and School's Aspen Conducting Academy.

Saunders has attended music festivals in the United States and abroad, including Aspen Music Festival and School, Ensemble Evolutions at the Banff Centre (CA), Blackbird Creative Lab, Music Academy of the West, Accademia Musicale Chigiana (IT), Castleman Quartet Program, LyricaFest, Bowdoin International Music Festival, Astona International Festival (CH), and International Music Academy at Pilsen (CZ). Former chamber music mentors include members of the Cleveland, Takacs, Cavani, Zemlinsky, Fry Street, and Ying Quartets, as well as International Contemporary Ensemble, eighth blackbird, Charles Castleman, Laura Bossert, and Terry King.

Saunders holds a Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) in Cello Performance from the University of Colorado Boulder, where he served as Teaching Assistant to Prof. David Requiro. Additional degrees include Master of Music (MM) in Music Performance from Boise State University, where he studied with Dr. Brian Hodges, and Bachelor of Music (BM) in Cello Performance from the University of Michigan School of Music, Theater and Dance, where he studied with Prof. Richard Aaron.
